## Reunion brings family and friends together at old Holley school

Only memories and mostly black-and-white photos remain of the old Holley Elementary School, once the hub of the small community. Two generations ago the population of the area began to explode, creating a need to build a new facility in Navarre and eventually even more schools to accommodate area students. Although the old school was demolished, those with connections to Holley are planning to keep its memories alive at the 3rd Annual Holley Community Reunion. Organizers of the event are asking folks to bring a covered dish and memories to share at the potluck picnic, scheduled for Saturday July 20, at the site of the old school - now the county-owned Holley Ball Park.

"The old Holley school was our community social center. We did everything there. Carnivals to hurricane shelters, and softball games to voting booths. Everyone knew everyone in our community," said Kathleen Bunyan-Passmore, who coordinates the annual event.

"Some time ago I posted on Facebook, 'Oh Lord, how I miss the old fish fries we use to have at the old Holley Elementary School.' I closed down my computer and went to bed. The next night when I got back on Facebook, I found 57 posts

from others who also missed it," added Bunyan-Passmore, noting "Holley was, and remains today, a strong community because of its people. Holley has a rich history that needs to be shared."

Built in 1926, the five-room schoolhouse had a kitchen sink crafted out of one half of a 50-gallon steel drum. In the early years, classes were smaller and up to three grades shared a classroom with only one teacher. Substitute teachers were a frequent sight because finding teachers willing to drive the great distance to work at the school was challenging.

Many former students recall the auditorium's theater seating and velvet stage curtains. The third


Saturday of each month the auditorium became the community's theater, featuring western or horror flicks, or serials such as Tarzan. The cost of the movie was just 25 cents, and the theater curtains were bought with proceeds from an entertaining presentation of "The Womanless Wedding," through which raised enough money to fund the purchase.

The school also hosted

an annual Halloween carnival featuring cracker-eating and apple-bobbing contests, along with a popular cakewalk held outside the school. Girls and boys would hold hands and walk until a gun was fired. Those lucky enough to be standing on pre-marked spots when the shot went off won cakes. Another fun activity included girls selling boxed

lunches their mom's helped them make. Boys would bid on the lunches and also win the company of the young lady while they ate.

There wasn't a local high school years ago, so after the eighth grade, students were transported via an old Army ambulance to the high school in Milton. Chanley Tolbert later purchased a bus which his son, Raymond Tolbert, drove. Betty Hawkins, who attended the school and has lived in Holley all of her life, remembers how Tolbert



would tease and accelerate on purpose as she boarded.

It's fun-filled memories like those fondly recalled by Hawkins which have made the annual event popular with former students. However, anyone who has lived in Holley or has ties to the community is invited to come share past memories and create new ones. At least for one afternoon each year the site comes alive again with the sounds of children having fun, an experience which seems to never be forgotten.


